Harvest of Hope (HOH) at the Dublin Food Pantry

This year we have been asked to provide Jiffy Cornbread and Canned Cranberry Sauce. This collection is a signature event of the pantry and is their Thanksgiving food drive. It is no longer a one-day pick-up, but rather they will be adding an extra box of Thanksgiving food to a client's monthly visit throughout the month of November. St. Patrick's has participated in this event since its very beginning. Think about buying in bulk from Costco, Aldi, GFS. This will help us fulfill the request. Drop donations in the red wagon near the doors to the narthex and we will deliver to the pantry. Or...you can drop the items at the Dublin Food Pantry. As you enter the pantry from the parking lot behind the church there will be a box marked "HOH" on the right side of the hallway where the pantry food is dropped off. You should first weigh the food on the hallway scale and record it in the log book. Then put it in the designated HOH box and write it on the clipboard provided. The pantry will keep the running tally on the clipboard to let us know when we have reached our goal. **The deadline for drop off is Oct. 17th.** If you have any questions, contact the church office.
